Carlos Araujo is a communications and public information professional with more than 30 years' experience in international media outlets like the BBC World Service (1985-2002) and in the United Nations Peacebuilding and Political Missions, including the UN Mission in Angola, as spokesperson (2002-2003); as editor, in the News and Media Division of the Department of Public Information in the UN Secretariat in New York (2004-2010); as spokesperson for UNMIT, the UN Mission in East Timor (2010-2012); as chief of Radio Okapi in the UN Mission in the Democratic Republic Of Congo (2012-2015), the biggest UN peacekeeping radio in the world; and most recently as Chief of Communications and Public Information in UNAMID, the AU-UN Hybrid Mission in Darfur (2015-2018).

Carlos graduated in journalism and social communication from the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium and started his professional career in media outlets in his country, Cape Verde and Portugal. He has also experience as a media trainer, having conducted courses for the BBC in Mozambique and for the UN in Guinea Bissau.
