Felix Nkongho is currently the Chairman for the Centre for Human Rights and Democracy in Africa, of which he was the Executive Director between 2015 and 2017. He currently lectures on Human Rights and Public Liberties, Legal Research and Methodology, Justice and Institutions, and International Criminal Cooperation and Criminal Procedure at the University of Buea Faculty of Law and Political Science; and at the Pan African Institute for Development West Africa.

Felix was previously Legal Officer with UNAMA, the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (2013-2015), and with MONUSCO, the United Nations Missions in the DRC (2010-2012); Human Rights Officers with UNAMA (2009-2010), Legal Officer in Trial Chamber I with the Special Court for Sierra Leone (2006-2008), and previously practiced law with the Liberty Law Firm and with the Amity Law Office between 1993 and 2005, and Legal Advisor with the Committee for the Defence of Human Rights in Cameroon.

Felix holds a Bachelor of Laws (License en Droit) from Yaounde University, a BL Second Class Upper Division from the Nigerian Law School in Lagos, a Master of Laws (LLM) from Vrije Universiteit Brussels, and an LLM in International Human Rights Law (cum laude) from the University of Notre Dame, Indiana USA. He has an extensive list of legal publications to his name, and has most recently (2017-2018) made numerous presentations including at the Canadian House of Commons, the USA Congress, the UK House of Lords and others on the Human Rights situation in Cameroon.
