



### **Ignacio Tredici**

Mr Ignacio Tredici is a senior legal adviser with more than twenty years of professional experience at both national and international levels in the prosecution of national and international crimes, as well as in legal and judicial reform projects. He has worked in the consolidation of the rule of law and the provision of technical assistance in criminal justice matters in post-conflict states like Rwanda, Cambodia, Tunisia, DRC, Central African Republic, Sudan, South Sudan, and Mali.

In the 90's, as a young lawyer and prosecutor ad-hoc, Mr Tredici worked in his native Argentina in the so-called *Trials of Truth*: judicial enquiries aimed at recovering the bodies of people abducted, tortured and disappeared during the Argentine dictatorship. From 2004 he worked at the International Criminal Tribunal for Rwanda where he prosecuted genocide cases, at both trial and appeal levels. In 2009 he became Head of the Legal Unit at the Khmer Rouge Tribunal, in Cambodia, where he coordinated the investigations into the international crimes committed by the regime led by Pol Pot in the 70's.

In 2011 he joined the UN Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights as a Human Rights Officer where he designed the OHCHR's strategy for the consolidation of the rule of law in Tunisia. Since 2014 Mr Tredici has been based at the United Nations Global Service Centre, in Brindisi, from where he has deployed to post-conflict states to assist in legal reform, judicial reform, and capacity building of magistrates.

Mr Tredici has published extensively on rule of law and international criminal law issues. He earned his law degree at the *Universidad Nacional del Litoral (Argentina)* and holds an LLM in international and transnational criminal law and human rights from the *Università degli Studi di Teramo (Italy)*.
