Ms Miriam Ghalmi is currently serving as Chief of the Protection of Civilians/Humanitarian Liaison Section with UNAMID, the UN-AU Operation in Darfur, and has been working for the UN Department of Peacekeeping Operations, and with the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights for more than 15 years. She has extensive experience working on protection of civilians and human rights in conflict and post conflict environments in Africa (Great Lakes, Horn of Africa) and in the Middle East.

Before joining UNAMID, she was most recently with UNMIK, the UN's Executive Authority Mission in Kosovo, where she established and led the Human Rights Section of the Mission. She also established and led the Protection of Civilians Section in MINUSMA, and served as the political Head of Office for UNMISS in Western Equatoria (South Sudan). She was Human Rights Advisor to the Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Somalia in the UN Political Office for Somalia (UNPOS) and served with OHCHR in Geneva as Deputy Coordinator for the Middle East and North Africa.

Miriam has a Master Degree in Political Science and International Relations from Sorbonne University in Paris, and a Post-Master Degree in Political Science (Contemporary Arab World) from the School of Political Studies in Paris (Science Po, Paris). She has a BA in Classical Arabic and Hindi from the National School of Oriental Languages and Civilizations in Paris.
